## The Fish Doorbell



If you google "fish doorbell" you might be surprised by what you find. You will find an actual fish doorbell. The website <https://visdeurbel.nl/en/> allows you to ring a doorbell to open up a door for fish.

There is a camera that shows you in real time when fish will pass. In the Netherlands, a barge was stationed in a river, but it was soon realized that there was no way for the fish past the barge to get to other side in order to find food.

At first, there was a plan to have a gatekeeper open a door in the barge once a day to allow fish to the pass through to the other side. The fish would have to wait, unfortunately birds and other predators would pounce upon the fish to eat them while they waited like "sitting ducks" for the door to be opened. A fun and creative alternative was found to enable the fish to get to the other side. There is an underwater camera that livestreams, letting viewers see when a fish arrives at the gate. When you are watching online and spy a fish, you can ring the doorbell. This notifies the on-land gatekeeper on to open the gate. You can only do this in the months from March to May, so why not log on to <https://visdeurbel.nl/en/> and help some fish get to the other side.

Holy Week is the week between Palm Sunday and Easter, this year, from April 13, to April 20, 2025. This includes Palm Sunday (April 13), Maundy Thursday (April 17), Good Friday (April 18), Holy Saturday (April 19), and Easter Sunday (April 20).

Palm Sunday celebrates Christ's triumphant entry into Jerusalem, which is the event that begins Holy week. Many worshipers commemorate this by waving palm branches and shouting "Hosanna," recreating the original Biblical crowd's cheerful welcome.

Maundy Thursday, derived from the Latin "commandment," commemorates Jesus's instruction to "love one another." Worshipers receive individual absolution (which mirrors Ash Wednesday's ashes and signifying the end of Lent), during the service—Also reenacting the Last Supper and Jesus washing his disciples' feet.

Good Friday is a somber service, commemorating Jesus's crucifixion and sacrifice for humanity's sins. It's a day of reflection and humility, marked by the absence of Holy Communion—as it represents the breaking of Jesus's body on the cross.

Easter Sunday celebrates Jesus's resurrection, which is a joyful victory over sin and death.

Holy Week is an amazing and important time for prayer, repentance, and drawing closer to God.



**AFANG SOUP**




